Testing	Asymptomatic testing will no longer be expected to be done regularly by staff and students. Tests will only be avaliable to use in the event of an outbreak. Anyone with symptoms should book a PCR test and if positive follow the latest government guidance. The school will follow the Outbreak Management plan if advised by the Local Director of Public Health, which may require testing.	Staff Students
Self-Isolation	There is no longer a legal requirement to self-isolate, however if test positive (LFD or PCR) it is advised that you stay at home and avoid contact with others for at least 5 full days and then continue to follow the guidance until you have received two negative test results on consecutive days. Contact tracing is no longer in place and contacts are not longer required to self-isolate unless positive. If you live with someone who is positive with COVID-19 you are advised to minimise contact with the person, limit close contact with other people outside your household, wear a well-fitting face covering and follow the advice for 10 days. If you develop symptoms take a PCR test and avoid others until you receive the result. Students and staff who live with someone who has COVID-19 should continue to attend school as normal. If you are a close contact follow guidance on how to stay safe.
