How to support your child at KS3 - Music	
General	As your child deepens and extends their musical interests they will:
	 Perform, listen to, review and evaluate music from a range of historical periods, genres, styles and traditions, including the works of famous composers and musicians. Learn to sing, and to use their voices to create and compose music on their own and with others. Have opportunities to learn a musical instrument and use music technology appropriately. Understand and explore how music is created, produced and communicated, including a knowledge of pitch, dynamics, tempo, timbre etc.
	To support your child:
	 Try to expose your child to as wide a variety of music as you can. Attend music concerts of all types and introduce your child to choirs and orchestras. Ask your child to listen to the music played while you are out in shops, restaurants and other public places. Do they notice any differences between the types of music played in different places? Play music while your child is doing homework, chores, completing a puzzle or other similar activities. Ask your child to choose what music they think is most appropriate for each type of activity. Encourage your child to learn to play a musical instrument (see below) Encourage your child to join an extra-curricular musical activity (see below) Check out all the projects your child will cover here in music sharepoint.
