

Terms of Reference The Full Governing Body

QUORUM

The Governing Body will meet at least termly.

A quorum of the governing body is <u>one half of the membership</u> (rounded up to a whole number) is determined in relation to the number of governors <u>in post</u>. For example, if the full membership is 15 then the quorum for a governing body meeting is 8 governors regardless of any vacancies.

FUNCTIONS

Governors

- 1. The co-option of governors.
- 2. The election of the chair and vice chair of governors

COMMITTEES & SUB COMMITTEES

- 1. The establishment (and abolition) of any Committees.
- 2. The establishment of terms of reference for any committees including the delegation of any powers of decision.
- 3. The receipt of reports from the Chair Persons of Committees. Monitoring the work of the Committees and ensuring that they follow the intentions of the full governing body.
- 4. To ensure that Religious Education and a daily act of Christian collective worship are provided
- 5. To ensure that the school adopts a balanced treatment of political and religious issues and avoids political or religious indoctrination.
- 6. To decide policy on charging and remissions
- 7. To decide any changes in the times of school sessions and the dates of school terms and holidays
- 8. To approve the Annual Budget
- 9. To agree any general principles for pupil discipline
- 10. To take action as required or permitted by law on matters relating to admissions.
- 11. To adopt and review a home school agreement



- 12. To appoint Head and Deputy Headteachers in conjunction with the Trust
- 13. To review progress made with the annual School Improvement Plan
- 14. To agree the policy for the appointment of teaching staff
- 15. To form a staff Dismissal Committee and a Dismissal Appeal Committee as required
- 16. To form a pupil Discipline Committee
- 17. To decide on such matters as may be delegated to Committees and Selection Panels.
- 18. To prepare an action plan on receipt of an inspection report from OFSTED
- 19. To consider all such matters which fall outside of the remit of any of its committees or sub committees.
- 20. To give consideration to such matters as may become the responsibility of governors in the future.
- 21. To ensure that the school adopts a rigorous Safeguarding Policy.
